You probably already started to think about a career field you would like to get into or a degree in a related career field. If you didn't know, I would refer you to some free Career Counseling & Assessments section. You probably even thought about where to attend a training facility. Also, in the "Additional Funding Information" guide, I would point you towards the College & University Search Resources.

According to the University Search Database, at present there are over 9500+ Colleges, Community Colleges & Universities in the United States of America (USA). There are 35 - Public & Private Colleges & Universities located in the state of Alaska alone. *Universitysearch.com, Retrieved 8/31/11 from http://www.univsearch.com/program.php*

We're one of the most educated in the today's world. Education is not a guarantee of employment. Please work closely with your Employment Specialist & Job Center to help you with your goals. There you can find out what is in high demand.

According to the US News University Directory, the Associate's degree coursework should generally take you two years of full-time study, though certain programs can require as much as three years. Bachelor's degree should generally take you four years of full-time study, though this can vary; some accelerated students finish in three years, while a few of the more complicated bachelor's degree programs can require up to five. Certification programs provide the appropriate education &, after completion, you can receive a document that certifies you as properly trained. Completing an online certificate program or course generally takes between two months & one year, though there are rare exceptions that require more time."

One of the things to keep in mind, regarding **Supplemental Funding**, is that all Scholarships & Grants are considered Supplemental Income. Meaning that most funding does not cover all costs – you have to search for more funding. The "Additional Funding Information" document can be used as a guide to seek out those funds, you don't have to remember everything, & you have this guide to get you started.

Now, **Full Ride Scholarships** pay for all expenses related to a college education, including tuition, books & housing expenses. These awards give students an opportunity to attend college free of all financial obligations, & are among the most coveted (in demand) & the most competitive of all scholarships. In order to qualify for one of these top prizes, students must have an outstanding academic record.

If you're planning to attend school, just make sure that the school is accepting **FAFSA**. FAFSA stands for "Free Application For Student Aid." If you go to a FAFSA website & they want money, cancel cancel cancel, as this could very well be the wrong website – There is not charge to fill out this FAFSA application.

First, you will need to request a pin number. This can take about 1-3 days to get your pin number. Then you can fill out your FAFSA using your pin number. You can fill out the FAFSA Application online, even if you're not enrolled in school or even selected a school yet. You will just need to update the information once you have selected a training facility.

Again, this is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). What you're applying for is the Pell Grant. The Pell grant is free monies you do not have to pay back, if you are awarded. The Pell award amount is up to \$5,550, & is split up between two semesters. If you're not eligible for the Pell, you might be offered loans. No, matter what individual state or school filing deadline, when it comes to your FAFSA; fill out the application online by January 1 of each year. Keep track of the deadlines by marking your calendar. The longer you wait, the less chances there are for other funding that might be available to you. *Student Financial Aid Services, Inc. Go ahead & start seeking out funding before you pick a school. Use a small pocket **Calendar** that you can carry around or use an online calendar that can notify you of upcoming deadlines. Try to locate one scholarship every day. Review each funding to determine your eligibility. Make notes on the deadlines & put them on a calendar. Set up reminders. Allow at least a week to a month to put materials together. Mail or fax your application as directed.

Are you are not sure what career field is right for you? Not sure what industry to look into? Do you want to find a job that suits you? There are Career Counseling & Assessment Counselors that can help you explore career fields. You can take assessment tests such as the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator Instrument tests, EUREKA Skills Sort, the Strong Interest Inventory tests, or maybe a Self Directed Searches. In the mean time, I would recommend the following:

Please create your own portfolio once you initially get onto the system. This will allow you to use your own portfolio sign-on as well as be able to collect important & interesting information you can discover on the site, & save any Assessment Tool results for future use.

Assessment Tools.

IDEAS: Take this interest assessment on-line. Learn which occupations match your interests.

SKILLS: Identify occupations that use the skills you like. It also helps you recognize skills that transfer between occupations. You can use SKILLS to select occupations to explore, identify ways to modify your career direction, or prepare for a job interview.

Work Importance Locator: Fill out this assessment online. Identify the importance of work values to you. Then explore occupations that match your values.

- Most Scholarship or Grant applications are deadline orientated, that could mean 1 time a year up to 4 times a year to apply for funding.
- Document deadlines on the calendar of funding you're applying for.
- Fill out applications 1-2 months in advance while gathering required documents continuously.
- It is also a good habit to use your calendar for your assignments.

Lending Institutions & Information

I hope that you will not need to take out a loan, but if you do, try to take out the smallest amount of a loan possible. Don't wait until school is out to start repaying back your loan. Start paying back your loan as soon as possible. Continue to work with your financial aid officer & keep them informed of what funding your applying for. Continue to look for funding, this is an ongoing search as all scholarships, & grants are considered supplemental funding, meaning you have to apply for many funding sources constantly. Document your scholarship/grant deadlines on a calendar or Google calendar & begin filling out those identified scholarships/grants.

Look for a lending institution that has low interest rates. Use up all of your scholarship & grant money before you borrow for school & when taking out student loans, make sure you have borrowed all of your federal student loans before applying for a private college loan. Free money like grants & scholarships will help reduce the amount of federal & private college loans that you will need to borrow & pay back.

Repaying your loan:

When it comes time to start repaying your student loan(s), you can select a repayment plan that's right for your financial situation. Generally, you want to look for low interest rate with 10 to 25 years to repay your loan, depending on which repayment plan you choose.

How to Pay Off Your Loans

I have some websites that can give you some additional information and there are some things to think about in the meantime. I highly recommend starting paying back any loans quickly. Do not wait until school is out. Late or missing payments as this can hurt your credit score and cause withholding of tax refunds and social security payments. Even if you go bankrupt, you still have to payback your student loans. Don't wait and contact your lender to discuss what options are available to you.

Question's to ask or think about: How much can I afford monthly? Do I qualify for a loan forgiveness program? Can I apply for payment plans or other payment methods? What about deferment or forbearance options, do I qualify? Am I facing financial hardship? Is there income based payment plan available? Am I qualified to consolidate my loans? - Again, do not wait and contact your lender to discuss what options are available to you.

Seeking Employment:

- One way to search is to look for businesses by occupation, not by job title. Searching for what you think you need to look for, like a certain job title, you are actually limiting your job search.
- Look for business owner who is hiring or contracting with other individuals to provide services; you must determine whether you're hired as an employee or independent contractor.
- Start searching for jobs right away & as often as you can. Get an idea what is out there within your career field. The most qualified candidates searching for & finding the right job can take some time. Students are encouraged to start searching for jobs long before graduation takes place.

Definitions (Back to Table of Contents)

Academic Terms: Quarter / Semester / Trimester. Quarter System: Divided into thirds instead of fourths, unless you choose to take summer classes. 10 weeks long plus one week for finals. Ranges from 9 to 12 classes in a year. Quarters start later — mid-September — & stay in school until around mid-June. Academic year into four terms. Semester System: 15 weeks long plus one week for finals, so that puts you in school for 32 weeks, approx 5 classes. Two semesters = 10 classes. Starts around Mid August. A semester gives you more time to make up class work & get the hang of things. Academic year into two terms. *Trimesters Systems:* Trimester terms are typically 10 or 11 weeks long. Academic year into three terms of relatively equal length.

Associate degree: An award that normally requires at least two but less than four years of full-time equivalent college work.

Bachelor's degree: An award (baccalaureate or equivalent degree, as determined by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Education) that normally requires at least four years but not more than five years of full-time equivalent college-level work. This includes ALL bachelor's degrees conferred in a five-year cooperative (work-study plan) program. (A cooperative plan provides for alternate class attendance & employment in business, industry, or government; thus, it allows students to combine actual work experience with their college studies.) Also, it includes bachelor's degrees in which the normal four years of work are completed in three years.

Credit course: A course that, if successfully completed, can be applied toward the number of courses required for achieving a degree, diploma, certificate, or other formal award.

Credit hour: A unit of measure representing an hour (50 minutes) of instruction over a 15-week period in a semester or trimester system or a 10-week period in a quarter system. It is applied toward the total number of hours needed for completing the requirements of a degree, diploma, certificate, or other formal

Degree: An award conferred by a college, university, or other postsecondary education institution as official recognition for the successful completion of a

Degree-seeking students: Students enrolled in courses for credit who are recognized by the institution as seeking a degree or formal award. At the undergraduate level, this is intended to include students enrolled in vocational or occupational programs.

Financial aid applicant: Any applicant who submits any one of the institutionally required financial aid applications/forms, such as the FAFSA. Full-time student (undergraduate): A student enrolled for 12 or more semester credits, 12 or more quarter credits, or 24 or more contact hours a week each

Grade-point average (academic high school GPA): The sum of grade points a student has earned in secondary school divided by the number of courses taken.

The most common system of assigning numbers to grades counts four points for an A, three points for a B, two points for a C, one point for a D, & no points for an E or F. Unweighted GPA's assign the same weight to each course Weighting gives students additional points for their grades in advanced or honors courses.

Graduate student: A student who holds a bachelor's or equivalent, & is taking courses at the post-baccalaureate level.

High school diploma or recognized equivalent: A document certifying the successful completion of a prescribed secondary school program of studies, or the attainment of satisfactory scores on the Tests of General Educational Development (GED), or another state-specified examination.

Internship: Any short-term, supervised work experience usually related to a student's major field, for which the student earns academic credit. The work can be full- or part-time, on- or off-campus, paid or unpaid.

Liberal arts/career combination: Program in which a student earns undergraduate degrees in two separate fields, one in a liberal arts major & the other in a professional or specialized major, whether on campus or through cross-registration.

Master's degree: An award that requires the successful completion of a program of study of generally one or two full-time equivalent academic years of work beyond the bachelor's degree. Some of these degrees, such as those in Theology (M.Div., M.H.L./Rav) that were formerly classified as "first-professional", may require more than two full-time equivalent academic years of work.

Number of Credits: Freshman / Sophomore / Junior / Senior. Freshman – fewer than 30-32 credits. Sophomore 30-64 credits, Junior = 60-96 credits, Senior 90-96 credits. Since degrees require that specific courses be satisfactory completed, the attainment of 123 hours in itself may not guarantee graduation. Be sure to check with your school to find out how many hours you exactly need

Out-of-state tuition: The tuition charged by institutions to those students who do not meet the institutions or state's residency requirements.

Part-time student (undergraduate): A student enrolled for fewer than 12 credits per semester or quarter, or fewer than 24 contact hours a week each term.

Tuition: Amount of money charged to students for instructional services. Tuition may be charged per term, per course, or per credit.

Undergraduate: A student enrolled in a four- or five-year bachelor's degree program, an associate degree program, or a vocational or technical program below the baccalaureate.

Unit: a standard of measurement representing hours of academic instruction (e.g., semester credit, quarter credit, contact hour).

Volunteer work (as admission factor): Special consideration given to students for activity done on a volunteer basis (e.g., tutoring, hospital care, working with the elderly or disabled) as a service to the community or the public in general.
